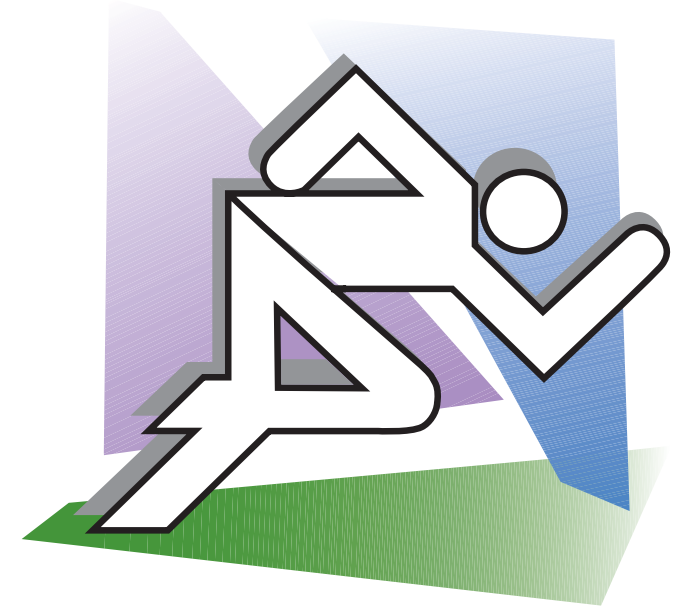

Michael Twist was a pretty normal 17-year-old boy. He taught himself to play guitar, starred in his school plays, and did a mean Austin Powers impression. But he also loved to give back, and was a regular blood and platelet donor at his local blood bank.

Michael also coached youth soccer and started a scholarship fund in memory of a favorite teacher. He had just graduated from high school when he gave one of his short life's biggest gifts. Even though they were thousands of miles from each other when Michael was in a car accident, his parents both had the same thought—Michael would want to be a donor.

They contacted the hospital, and were able to donate his eyes and other tissue to help others. "Michael just took over in that moment, and it has helped us heal, knowing his last act was to benefit others like he would have wanted," said Michael's mother Michele.
